Dear Honorable Attorney General of Panama
and Dr. Fernando Nunez Fabrega:

Please receive my cordial greetings and allow me to introduce myself. I am Richard S. Lehman, a Florida attorney, the appointed Executor in the case involving the Estate of Wilson C. Lucom, (the "Estate" or the "Will"). This case has been in the Panama judicial system for more than three years in spite of the fact that it is a testamentary succession proceeding. Mr. Wilson Lucom (R.I.P.) left an Estate of more than \$50.0 Million and in his Will directed the majority be used to feed the poor children of Panama.

In the fall of 2008 the National Transparency Council Against corruption (The "Transparency council") wrote to the Chief Justice of the Panama Supreme Court, Dr. Harley Mitchell, requesting a review of corruption in the testamentary succession proceeding of Wilson Lucom. See attached.

When the National Transparency Council filed its request, certain prominent members of the P.R.D., who exercised significant political influence over the persons who had been appointed to judicial and political positions, attempted to prevent dissemination of this report that was pertinently filed by the Transparency Council's office. Therefore, to the best of my knowledge no action was undertaken on the first request filed by the National Transparency Council to begin an investigation on this case.

However, from everything I have heard and seen, the new Government offers a positive environment that now will bring equal justice to both rich and poor alike. I hope for Panama's sake and the sake of the poor children of Panama that vitality which arrives as a breath of fresh air will become a strong cleansing wind and that you will help to strengthen and purify that healthy environment.

What you will see after you have studied the exhibits will make you sad for Panama, because you will have clear evidence of the judicial corruption of the Panama legal system which has had only one evil purpose in mind.

Said evil purpose of this small group of individuals was to make sure that not one penny of the millions of dollars that Wilson C. Lucom provided in his will to feed the poor children of Panama would ever be used to feed the poor children. Instead it would feed the greedy habits of one powerful Panamanian family.

You will be sad for Panama because you will see that for three years in spite of the laws of Panama, the corruption of those laws has been successful. To date not one death of a malnourished child has been prevented as Mr. Wilson C. Lucom (R.I.P.) would have wanted. Hundreds of thousands of dollars of Lucom's money has been wasted to pay opposing lawyers, and to pay an illegally appointed Court Administrator and other wasteful expenses. Not one penny has been spent on the children.

I hope and request that after studying the enclosed you will reopen the investigation that Mrs. Alma Montenegro de Fletcher hoped to start almost two years ago. The cumulative hard evidence provided to you in the accompanying documentation paints a picture of the death of your country's most helpless citizens, solely as a result of legal corruption. It is a picture that no decent country can ignore without serious consequences to its entire society.

If you choose to reopen this investigation, in order to aid in your investigation, I am providing you with a Report that will be very useful. The reason for the length of the Report and the depth of the documentation is because I hope the Report will help you as an investigative memorandum. As you will see from the Exhibits, since I am an attorney I have carefully preserved every piece of evidence. I hope this will help you to easily understand the crimes and constitutional violations that have been committed against me, my collaborators and the children in this case.

I and many others know that nothing but good can come from your review of this case. The truth that will be exposed by an independent investigation of this matter will set Panama free from corruption of this level with such an evil intent. It will show your country does not tolerate it and that certainly such corruption

will not be rewarded. Panama needs this investigation, your poor children need this investigation and justice needs it.

I am respectfully submitting this request with the hope you will consider and proceed with my request.
